CALL TO ORDER:

The Vice-Chairman called the regular meeting to order. Lt. Jeremy Lind gave the invocation and the audience remained standing for the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING AND APPROVAL - CONVEYANCE OF UTILITY EASEMENTS TO DOMINION VIRGINIA POWER (TRAIL):

Public Hearing was held to consider the conveyance by Alleghany County of the following to Dominion Virginia Power:

- 1. A 15' wide by approximately 91' long utility easement across the Jackson River Scenic Trail (between property owned by Rodney and Doris Kyle and Melissa Green) to install underground facilities and remove overhead electric lines (plat #13-17-0033).
- A 15' wide by approximately 92' long utility easement along the Jackson River Scenic Trail (between property owned by Harry and Amanda Sargent and William Reynolds) to install underground facilities and remove overhead electric lines (plat #13-17-0033).

The Vice-Chairman announced that this public hearing was advertised in the <u>Virginian Review</u> on Tuesday, February 28, 2017 in accordance with the <u>Code of Virginia</u>. He then called the public hearing to order.

Mr. Lanford stated that approximately a year ago Dominion Virginia Power requested and was conveyed two easements (one across the trail and one parallel to the trail) and now need two more easements from the portion parallel to the trail to two homes across the trail for underground service.

MS. SUSAN HAMMOND, VDOT RESIDENT ENGINEER - VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION UPDATE:

Mr. Lanford commented that Ms. Susan Hammond, VDOT Resident Engineer, is unable to attend the meeting tonight, but read a report on the following VDOT activities that was sent via email:

Maintenance

- County-wide pothole repair.
- County-wide brush cutting.
- Minor slide repair (majority on Route 220).
- Drainage and shoulder repairs County-wide due to heavy rains.
- Responded to citizen concerns.
- Upcoming maintenance work in March:
 - Start spring grading of stabilized roads
 - Hot mix asphalt patching (as weather permits)
 - Pothole repair

Construction

- Installed pipe on Route 781 (Rucker Gap Road) for rural rustic project. Remainder to be done later this month.
- Bids received for Route 696/Exit 21 project. Phillips Construction LLC from Kentucky was the apparent low bidder at \$3,655,275.82.

Mr. Lanford added that the Route 696/Exit 21 project bid exceeded the revenue sharing amount by approximately \$240,000. He mentioned that the County submitted an additional revenue sharing application earlier in the year in order to cover any overages that might occur when bids came in. He commented that 50% would be paid for by the developer and 50% by VDOT.

Ms. Adcock asked if the Route 696/Exit 21 bid included contingency money. Mr. Lanford replied that no potential change orders were included.

Mr. Lanford stated that if the Board has any questions/comments for Ms. Hammond to let him know and he will forward them to her.

Mr. Garten commented regarding rocks and hanging trees on Rt. 220 near Honda Nissan potentially falling. He stated that there appears to be some wash boarding in the east lane of I64 from mile marker 5 to around Exit 10 or 14.

Mrs. Cox stated that she asked Ms. Hammond at a previous meeting regarding the road shoulders in the Crows area and Ms. Hammond responded to her that this was checked and there was nothing more to be done. She mentioned that Ms. Hammond is also checking on a traffic issue regarding trucks on Route 159.

APPROVE CONTRIBUTION TO CLIFTON FORGE MAIN STREET FOR THE ALLEGHANY HIGHLANDS HERITAGE DAY FESTIVAL:

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Lanford handed out and reviewed a memo with an update on various items. The memo is a part of the records of this meeting and is as follows:

Renewal of Capital Improvement Program

In summer of 2017, staff will renew our planning efforts and begin work on a new five-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The last was completed in 2011. Work will continue on the Program through fall. Adoption of a new CIP is anticipated to occur in December of 2017.

Code Compliance

On your April agenda for discussion will be proposed modifications to our Code Compliance Ordinance. Proposed changes are intended to reduce repeat offenders and assist with sprucing up our entrance corridors.

Intervale Property Development Public Meeting

The Public Meeting held on 16 February to discuss potential development of the County owned Intervale property for potential use by an outfitter was well attended. Approximately 25 people listened to the presentation and participated in question, answer, and conversation about the potential use. Proposal appeared to be well received. Staff will continue to proceed with development of property utilizing grant dollars.

Classification and Compensation Study

We have engaged Evergreen Solutions to assist with developing and improving our position and pay classification plan.

Reassessment

It is time to start the process for our 2019 Reassessment. Request for Proposals will be issued in early April 2017. At your April Board meeting, the Board will be asked to appoint two (2) members to serve on an evaluation committee.

Radio System Proposals

Proposals from vendors are due Friday, March 17, 2017 at 1:00 p.m. This project will be discussed in great detail as we move through our FY18 budget development.

Joint Services Committee

During our joint budget work session with the City of Covington last week, the topic of a Joint Services Committee was discussed. Moving forward, I would recommend appointing two (2) members from the Board of Supervisors to join two (2) members from City Council, the appointed managers, the Sheriff, Circuit Court Clerk, and Commonwealth Attorney. I would suggest quarterly meetings on a regular schedule. Your April agenda will contain an item to discuss appointments.

Carly Simmons was born May 27, 2011 to Ricky Simmons (Public Works employee) and Devin Vass. Carly was born with a Congenital Heart Defect and received a new heart later that same year. She was a happy, playful little girl despite several struggles with illness over the years. On February 15, 2017, Carly lost her battle. Funeral services were held at Arritt's on February 18.
